Agency Description

Alameda County Juvenile Hall is located in San Leandro, CA. This institution houses minors who have been adjudicated by the law. Some minors were waiting to return home, while others were waiting placements in various residential treatment facilities or being transferred to the California Youth Authority (CYA).

Camp Sweeny was a transitional placement for young men between 14 to 19 years-old. In addition to receiving education and vocational training, all residence where provided with the opportunity to have individual and/or group therapy. An 8-week psycho-educational group was mandatory for the parents of all residents. Parents were also required to attend three family intervention meetings.

Responsibilities:
